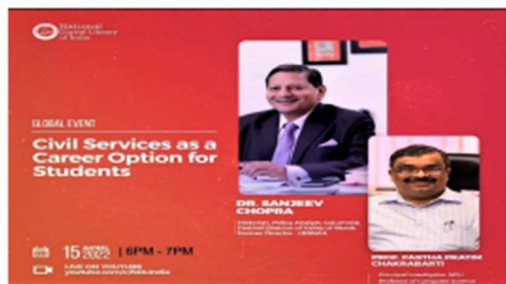

National e-counselling on competitive exams concludes

The four-day competitive examinations' national e-counselling "Spardha Setu" conducted by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Placement Cell of Government Girls' Post-Graduate College (GGPOC) concluded on the other day.

On the first day resource person Anil Dhakad, as-

stant director, finance, government of Madhya Pradesh, department of finance gave his lecture on UPSC and banking examinations. He gave elaborate information about the pattern of UPSC examinations, the syllabus, the span of examinations and the learning resources to be consulted. He also discussed the time schedule of the banking entrance examinations for Clerical

and PO level and preparation details for the same. On the second day assistant professor of chemistry, Government College, Shujalpur Virendra Singh gave counselling on MPPSC entrance examination. He suggested the books and magazines to be referred and detailed out the preparation strategies for prelims, mains and interview of the examination. The third day of the series

was dedicated to entrance examinations for teaching profession and research. Dr Divya Verma, assistant professor of Government College, Alot described the pattern and time schedule of NET (CSIR, JRF) and SLET for eligibility for teaching in colleges and universities and also for getting fellowships for doctoral or post doctoral research. On the concluding day

कौशल विकास के रूप में आयोजित किया जा रहा है। इस कार्यक्रम में 32 साल की आयु की छात्राओं को शामिल करने का उद्देश्य है। कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न विभागों, पदानों का उल्लेख करते हुए कहा कि इस पेशे के लिए समय सीमा में कार्य पूरा करना आवश्यक है। छात्राएं कार्य तकनीक, काम के अधिक घंटे लगातार यात्राएं, सामाजिकता, कोशलपूर्ण प्रवृत्ति, संचार कौशल, अच्छी टाइपिंग स्पीड और आधुनिक मैन्युफैचरिंग का पत्रकारिता में विशेष महत्व है।

All-round govt support available for bizwomen: Experts

"If one has a skill in handicrafts which can be turned into a business venture, there is a support network made available by the government from the level of training and raw material supply to organising sales exhibitions and licence acquisition. After preparing the Udyam Parichay on the online portal, registration on the Hast Shilp Vikas Nigam facilitates government procurement of the products. In the absence of lucrative retail business, it is advisable to register with such

government sites as DC Handicraft and MSME. An artisan card issued thereafter enables prioritisation in free stall acquisition at government exhibitions and tax benefits. These were the words of Prerna Dabhade, founder, Swastik Mahila Udyog, who was speaking at an e-mentoring session on 'Mantras of Women Entrepreneurship' organised by the IQAC, economics department and business incubation centre SYNERGY of the Government Girls' P-G College. Master crafts person and trainer Dabhade narrated her story of starting from getting

trained in batik, block, tie-and-dye printing from Bhairavgarh Industry Ujjain from Rahim Gutti and then making a cooperative society to forming many self-help groups and empowering several women. These groups travelled organising exhibitions of their products at national and international levels from Jaipur Art Gallery to Milan Festival in Europe. "Follow your passion instead of emulating to go far and use local resources for cost benefits. Ujjain has ample options, such as veg-

etables, poha, parmal, snacks and handicrafts for processing and branding," she added. The second speaker, Sumina Ligga, founder of Neo Ma Foods and president of Laghu Udyog Bharti's

women's unit, stated how during a financial crisis in the family she had started preparing pickles but could not recover the costs as she was using good quality raw material and had to shift to making tomato ketchup and supplying to hotels in Ujjain as early as in the 1990s. She gradually diversified her products into thirteen kinds, including continental sauce, soya sauce, green chilli sauce and so forth and developed a supply chain across Madhya Pradesh. Ligga said, whether initi-

ated due to economic compulsions or through passion, an enterprise yielded handsome returns over a long period of persevering journey. The food industry does not require many government registrations, she said and mentioned several examples of women entrepreneurs rising from scratch to become brand names in different sectors. "There are many opportunities in repacking, rebranding and branding existing products and online business. Working through SHGs or societies divides gains, but lessens risks," she said. In his presidential ad-

dress, senior professor of physics Dr VK Gupta said access to different portals and websites should be taken advantage of by the younger generation for turning their skills into formal start-ups. The welcome address was delivered by Dr Nancy Chauhan, head of the economics department. A thematic introduction was given by organising secretary and IQAC coordinator Dr Neeta Tapan. Guest introduction was given by Dr Abha Dixit. The programme was conducted by Dharmesh Rathore and the vote of thanks proposed by Dr GD Agrawal.

Education needn't be associated with start-up project: Expert

'There are no boundaries of age for thinking of launching a start-up'

The idea of a start-up can be a novel idea arising out of surroundings, network, internships, or experience and need not be associated with educational background. Therefore, there are no boundaries of age for thinking of launching a

start-up.

These were the words of Vasundhara Jain, founder of MyAnalysers, who was speaking as a resource person in an invited e-talk on 'Think Start-Up' organised by the Economics department and IQAC of the Government Girls' Post-Graduate College.

Talking about her journey, Vasundhara stated, "We had found in the UK that many researchers spend lot of time and money on mundane, repetitive and manual tasks which we thought of providing as hassle free services by our

start-up." She, therefore, recommended that the first thing in establishing a start-up was to form a pitch desk defining the problem statement and the solution, unique value



proposition, cost structure, revenue streams and existing alternatives.

Vasundhara added that Innovation, or first-time launching, is the differen-

tiating factor between a start-up and a business. She said that talking extensively and validating the idea beforehand is a must. The checklist before starting a venture includes financial requirements and sources, marketing, co-founders and team, legalities, ecosystem of users, payers and peers and mental training.

In his presidential address, in-charge principal Dr Hemant Gahlot elucidated examples of two of his students who started a hydropower turbine laboratory in a small room and

grew into international-level entrepreneurs. He said that such e-talks could be torch-bearers for youths who had a genuine inclination towards fructifying their ideas into start-ups.

Organising secretary and IQAC coordinator Dr Neeta Tapan gave the thematic introduction. Dr Nancy Chauhan, head of the Economics department, delivered the welcome address. The programme was conducted by Dr Abha Dixit and Dr Nikhil Joshi proposed the vote of thanks. Technical support was given by Vivek Dubey.

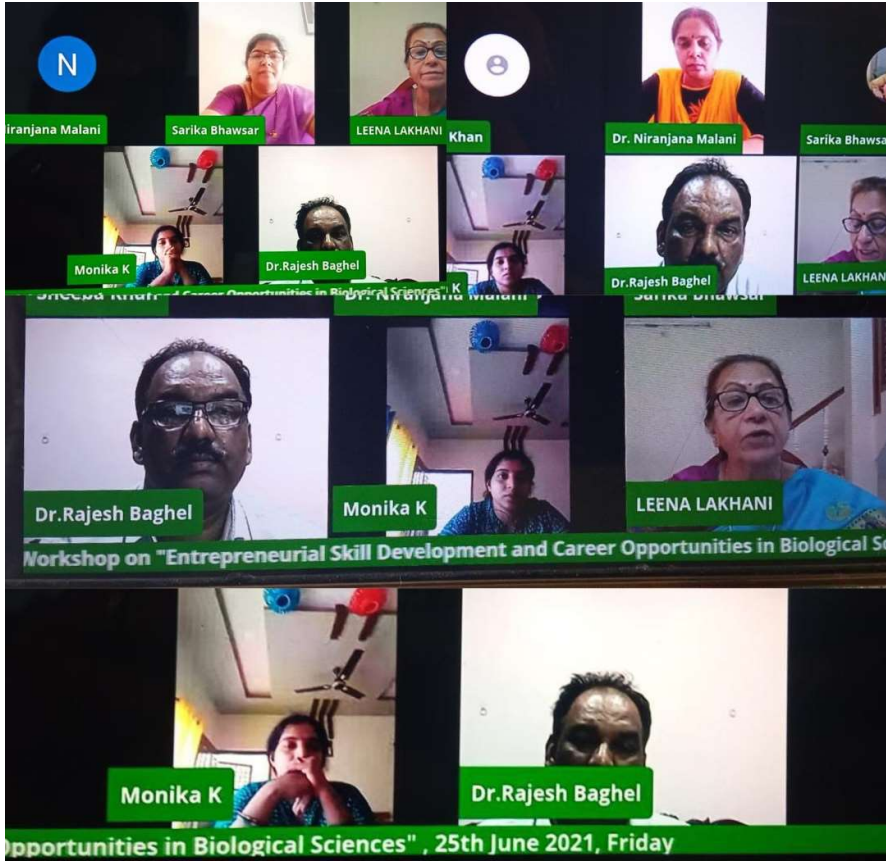

'Bee rearing can provide extra income to farmers'

On the day-4 of the seven-day e-workshop on 'Entrepreneurial Skill Development and Career Opportunities in Biological Sciences' Tuesday, Dr Rajeev Awasthi, president, Prakash Seva Sansthan, Bargarh (Chhattisgarh) talked about the benefits of beekeeping.

The programme is organised by the post graduate department of zoology and biotechnology of GGPJG under the aegis MPHEQIP World Bank Scheme.

The first guest speaker Dr Anandh gave a talk on tools and artificial bee hive for bee rearing. He touched upon the legal like arrangements for

food, water and optimum climatic conditions for bee rearing.

One 20-30 kg honey can be obtained from a single bee box. The market price of this quantity of honey is around Rs 4000-7000. Thus from 8-10 boxes one can earn an additional income of Rs 70,000.

National agriculture board provides financial subsidy in the ratio 50:50 farmer and government as well as bee box on a fixed price if an entrepreneur sends its proposal for starting a venture. Krishi Vigyan Kendra and forest department also provide appropriate assistance. Honey production can provide extra income for farmers if practised simultaneously with agriculture, he con-

cluded.

Ram Narayan, managing director, Pragny Progress Samajik Sansthan, Bargarh (Chhattisgarh) discussed how different varieties of honey can be ob-

tained from different trees that have wide medicinal properties. The honey from Sakhan tree can be used for curing heart disease. Kairati tree honey is used for treating skin diseases and Mahua tree honey is used as a immunity booster.

He discussed marketing approaches like preparation of a trademark and applying for a license. This business can also provide employment to others. A cooperative society going for systematic bee keeping in a calendar year can produce about 57 tons of honey in a year, he said.

The theme of the workshop was given by Dr Leena Lakshani, she said that honey is rich in nutrients and antioxidants. It can be used to produce wax, royal jelly, bee propolis and bee venom apart from honey. She also presented the concluding remarks and together with the guest speakers read out the queries of the viewers. Dr Prashant Acharya conducted the proceedings. Dr Rajesh Shargava introduced the guest speakers. Sheela Khan proposed the vote of thanks.

vation and processing of foxnut and discussed the employment opportunities in the field.

He said that foxnut is considered to be black diamond due to its nutritional values and it holds potential of 400% profit as one can earn four times of the initial invested capital from this crop.

Low sugar and fat content of the foxnut makes it an excellent medicine for treating various heart ailments, diabetes and stomach diseases. The residual products of foxnut processing is utilised by various medicinal industries, he added.

Principal Dr Anita Manchandia presided over the

session. Workshop convenor Dr Leena Lakshani introduced the nuances of horticulture and makhana culture. She said that horticulture crops are good sources of variety of nutrients and are rich in vitamins, minerals, flavour, aroma and dietary fibres.

Lac production Great source of income generation and biodiversity conservation

Dr Upendra Kumar Nag, an established authority on Lac of Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Kanker, (Chhattisgarh) was the subject expert on the fifth day on Monday of the seven-day e-workshop on Entrepreneurial Skill Development and Career Opportunities in Biological Sciences. The programme is being organised by the post-graduate department of zoology and biotechnology of GPGC under the aegis of MPHEQIP World Bank Scheme.

The guest speaker talked at length about the production and varieties of lac. Popularly known as Lakh in Hindi, lac is a resinous substance deposited on the twigs of various trees in India by the female lac insect. It is used in the manufacturing of varnishes, sealing wax, etc. and also in the production of a red colouring substance. Dr Nag's bilingual discussion explained in detail about thousands of species of lac in a very short time. He added that alternate crops of kusum trees, samiyalat, a wild shrub and apple trees are good for better production of lac. This way one can generate income round the year. Wide space between

two tree-rows helps in facilitating lac production while at the same time allowing the producer to grow cereal and vegetables in the empty space and earn cash on regular basis.

It is popularly believed that an individual can earn three times of his invested capital through lac production.

Introducing the theme Dr Leena Lakshani said that insect producing lac is not only of social and economic importance,

but also plays an important role in conserving biodiversity. It can live upon 400 species of plants to obtain its food and produce lac and also constitute a complex food web. She elaborated further that its entire host plant species is of medicinal, economic and social importance. A number of primary and secondary consumers and parasites live freely on lac producing plants without any clashes between them. She also presented the confiding remarks and together with the guest speaker resolved the queries of the viewers. Dr Vikrant Shah conducted the programme. Dr Pratibha Aichand introduced the guest speakers. Dr Hemlata Joshi proposed a vote of thanks. The technical assistance was provided by Sheeba Khan.

VERMICOMPOST: Black Gold for sustainable agriculture

On the day 3 of the 7 day e-workshop on 'Entrepreneurial Skill Development and Career Opportunities in Biological Sciences' organised by the post-graduate department of zoology and biotechnology of GGPGC under the aegis MPHEQIP World Bank Scheme, the first guest speaker Dr Sanjay Kannoje, CEO Jila Panchayat, Government of Chhattisgarh, Kanker on Saturday discussed the function and significance of Vermicom-

posting. He said that Vermicomposting involves the use of earthworms and is a sustainable alternative to commercially available chemical fertilisers. It helps restore soil fertility. He said that vermicomposting not only helps improve nutritional quality of the crop but also provides employment to the entrepreneurs. He explained in detail the models which Government of Chhattisgarh is focusing on to make vermicomposting an integral part in every district. Dr Komal Singh Keram,

soil analyst, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Kanker (Chhattisgarh), shed light on how vermicomposting is a biological indicator of soil health. Vermitechnology is

a combination of vermiculture and vermicomposting. Vermicompost is considered as a black gold for the health of the crops. It can also be used in dealing with the problem of exotic proliferation of Parthenium weed (Gajar Ghas) in India by using this weed as source of food to the earthworm in vermiculture, he added. He talked about the different species of earthworms which can be used for vermiculture and the physical and financial requirements for starting vermiculture as a new

business. He also threw light on different storing and packaging approaches used for prepared vermicompost and also how the properties of the vermicompost can be enriched by adding different microbial species. He concluded with an appeal to the viewers to exploit kitchen waste in setting up vermicomposting unit at home. Dr Leena Lakhani, convener of the programme, shared her concern about excessive use of chemical fertilisers which deteriorates land and reiterated that it can be overcome by

using vermicomposting as a powerful alternative to chemical fertilisers. She also told about the harmful effects of chemical insecticides and fertilisers which depletes the population of earthworm and after entering in the human body through food creates toxicity. Dr Nancy Chouhan conducted the proceedings. Dr Shalini Vijayvargiya introduced the guest speakers. Sakshi Sardana proposed a vote of thanks. Sheeba Khan and Shashwat Nigam provided technical assistance during the webinar.

Experts share info on 'queen of textiles'

On the second day of the seven-day e-workshop on Friday, guest speaker Dr Rajesh Baghel, additional director, directorate of sericulture, Chhattisgarh, presented ideas on 'Ecology, Biology and Rearing of Antheraea mylitta'. Dr Baghel talked in detail

about the rearing of silk worms and demonstrated through videos how the production of silk is done by combining two biological processes: First, the silk worm and second the host plant on which the silk worm relies for food and completes its life cycle. He also discussed the life cycle, egg production and cocoon formation in different varieties of silk worms and also highlighted the production of silk fibre from these cocoons. He acquainted the participants with the reeling, dyeing and printing of the silk in commercial units. He talked about the different types of silks like mulberry, tassar, eri and muga etc.

Mulberry silk is found in Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Jammu Kashmir. Tassar silk is found in Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh while Eri and Muga silk is a speciality of Assam. Monika Shridhar, the second

guest speaker and an entrepreneur of the Society of Tribal Welfare and Rural Education, Chhattisgarh, talked about how the society is providing employment to tribal women in Bastar. She told that tribal women are trained by them in reeling of silk to get an opportunity to work right from their home. 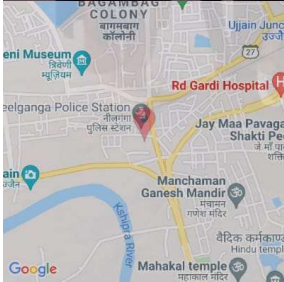
